The next morning she walked among her flowers, but there were no signs of any one having been there the night before.

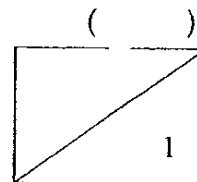

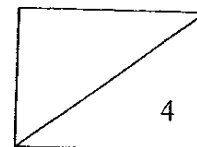

Ever since childhood, King Ludwig was fascinated with buildings and by the age of eight, he had a sketchbook filled with drawings of castles. When he was eighteen he was able to fulfill his dream. King Ludwig chose a high, rocky site for his new castle, which is today known as Neuschwanstein (New Swan Stone).

At first, the King had simply wanted to rebuild the castle that had once stood there but the more he worked on the plans, the bigger his castle became. When building works finally began, it had developed into one of the largest and loveliest castles in Germany.

It was, however, never completed, as building works stopped after King Ludwig's untimely death at just forty-one. Only the main rooms were furnished during his lifetime.

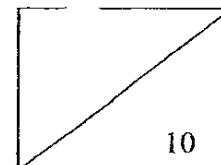
