

Ingredients A

- 1 kg of chicken wings
- 5 tablespoons of sesame oil
- 3 tablespoons of light sauce
- 8 tablespoons of oyster sauce
- 3 tablespoons of rice wine
- some ground pepper

Ingredients B

- 2 eggs
- some cornstarch



Steps:

- 1. Wash the chicken wings and leave them to dry by patting with a paper towel.
- Put the chicken wings into a big bowl and add in Ingredients A. Leave the chicken wings to marinate for at least an hour. Leave them longer, if you prefer a stronger taste.
- 3. Break two eggs into the big bowl.
- 4. Heat your pan and the cooking oil over medium to low fire. Cover the pan.
- Pour some cornstarch onto a plate. Coat the chicken wings with the cornstarch evenly and set them aside on a plate.
- 6. Once the pan is heated, place the chicken wings into the pan. Do this slowly and carefully to avoid splatter.
- 7. Fry the chicken wings for approximately four minutes each or until they turn golden brown. Ensure they are thoroughly cooked before removing them from the pan to serve.
