#### Section C: Comprehension (MCQ)

Lightning disrupted part of the MRT train service on the north-bound line for 80 minutes during the evening peak period on 24 May 1991. It struck a track near the Bishan Station and affected power supply to the train service. Train service between the Toa Payoh and Ang Mo Kio stations was stopped between 6.30 pm and 7.50 pm.

This was the second day that train service had been disrupted. On Tuesday, train service on the east-bound line between Clementi and Commonwealth Stations was stopped for nearly an hour. This was caused by a signalling fault on a train at Clementi Station.

Many irate passengers called the Straits Times to lodge a complaint against 10 the SMRT for poor train service. An accounts clerk, Jenny Tan, who lives in Bishan, said that she had to get off at the Toa Payoh Station at 6.20 pm. "Many passengers left to wait for buses or taxi. I didn't get home until 9 pm. I was in a foul mood and couldn't eat," she said.

Miss Elaine Lim, a systems analyst, was frustrated that the passengers on her train were not told that train service had resumed. "Most of us got off at Toa Payoh at 8.15 pm. But we saw many new passengers rushing into the train. Then only did I realise it could go beyond Toa Payoh," she said.

Mr John Frank, another disappointed passenger, said that the south-bound train he boarded at Yishun at 6.15 pm. took an hour to reach Ang Mo Kio where service was then discontinued. On Tuesday, the east-bound line was disrupted for 50 minutes from 6.50am to 7.40am.

Helen Keller, a woman from the small farm town of Tuscumbia, Alabama, taught the world to respect people who are blind and deaf. Her whole life was devoted towards that mission. She was born in 1880. When she was about two years old, she was extremely ill and lost both her vision and hearing. It was like entering into a different world with completely new rules. She got very frustrated and by the time she was seven, her parents knew they needed help. Therefore, they hired a tutor named Anne Sullivan.

Anne was strict, but she had a lot of energy. In just a few days, she taught Helen how to spell words with her hands. The trouble was, Helen did not understand what the words meant. Until one day, Anne had Helen hold one hand under the water. Then she spelled "W-A-T-E-R" into Helen's other hand. It was electric! Helen was finally able to relate the word to the object. Immediately, Helen bent down and tapped the ground. Anne spelt "earth" into her hand again. Helen's brain flew and on that day, she learnt 30 words.

From then on, Helen's mind raced ahead. She learnt to speak when she was ten by feeling her teacher's mouth when she talked. Often, people found it hard to understand her, but she never gave up trying. Meanwhile, she fearned to read French, German, Greek, and Latin in Braille. When she was twenty, she entered Radcliffe College, the women's branch of Harvard University. Her first book, called 'The Story of My Life', was translated into fifty languages. She wrote ten more books and a lot more articles.

Helen Keller travelled round the world to give speeches and raise money for many organisations. She received dozens of awards, such as the Presidential Medal of Freedom, the highest honor that an American civilian can receive. However, she died in her sleep in 1968, at the age of 87.
