Leeches are worm-like creatures which live in damp, dark places. These creatures attach themselves to any passing human or animal and begin to suck blood from them. Usually the person has no idea that he has a leech on him until some time later when he or his friends notice a patch of blood on his clothing.

Several decades ago, Dr Roy Sawyer, an American researcher recognised the potential benefits of "leech therapy" and started one of the world's first leech farms. In Dr Sawyer's farm, leeches are fed on a steady diet of blood from the local abattoirs. These leeches are often sold to scientists who want them for research. Some, however, are bought by doctors for use in surgery because leeches have been used successfully in operations where patients had to have their fingers stitched back on. Today, the company provides tens of thousands of leeches every year to hospitals in dozens of countries.

Leeches release certain chemicals into their victim's bloodstream as they suck blood from them. Doctors have found that some of these chemicals seem to help restore damaged cells in the body. Others encourage the blood to flow more freely. It is these chemicals that doctors find useful in surgery.

Not long ago, Dr Sawyer's leeches came to the rescue of a five-year-old boy in the United States. The boy's ear had been ripped off by a dog. Surgeons stitched on the boy's ear but there was still a problem—the blood would not flow from his body to his stitched-on ear. A batch of leeches was flown from Wales to America. Two were attached to the boy's ear. To the doctors' delight, the leeches immediately began to swell up with blood. This showed that they were causing the blood to flow back to the boy's ear.

Dr Sawyer feels that there is a bright future for leeches as life-savers, and he thinks that they will offer hope to people who suffer from heart attacks.

On 26 March 1991, Singapore Airlines Flight SQ117 was hijacked at 10.15 pm. The Airbus, carrying more than one hundred passengers and crew members, was flying from Kuala Lumpur to Singapore. Shortly after its departure from Kuala Lumpur, four men, who were passengers on the flight, took control of the plane. They were armed with explosives and knives. It was the first time this had happened to Singapore Airlines.

The plane touched down at Changi International Airport and was immediately surrounded by police officers. The four hijackers, who claimed to be members of the Pakistan People's Party, issued a list of demands. These included the release of certain prisoners in Pakistan and for the aircraft to be refuelled and flown to Australia.

The area in the vicinity of the plane was cordoned off and darkened as lights around the airport police station were turned off. Journalists and photographers were told to leave. Two crew members were thrown out of the plane, sustaining bruises and minor injuries. The hijackers gave a five-minute deadline, beyond which they threatened to kill one passenger every ten minutes if their demands were not met.

Racing against time, with only three minutes to the deadline, the Singapore government sent an order to storm the plane. Armed with weapons, a team of Singapore Armed Forces Commandos stormed the plane and mounted a swift rescue operation; they opened the doors of the aircraft from the exterior and entered it swiftly. Then, shouting at the passengers and crew to lower their heads, the commandos opened fire and all the four hijackers were shot dead!

All the other passengers and crew escaped unhurt. They stid down the emergency evacuation chutes near the wings of the aircraft which were lowered. They were later driven to the Airport Terminal in three buses. While all these were taking place, there was the usual early morning calm at the airport. In fact, many of the passengers checking in for their flights were unaware of the drama.

Later in that day, the Minister of Home Affairs held a press conference to announce the success of the rescue operation.
