Dinosaurs lived millions of years before human beings first appeared, and they all vanished for some reason. Some say that at some time in the past, the climate of the earth changed.

Most dinosaurs required enormous quantities of food. Eventually, they died of starvation because they could not get sufficient food to eat. Though most dinosaurs were huge reptiles, some were rather small - almost as small as the crocodiles of today - and yet they also died out. The reason could not have been insufficient food, so their extinction still baffles everyone today.

There is one small animal living today whose ancestors roamed the earth at the same time as the dinosaurs. It is considered by scientists to be very closely related to the dinosaurs, but not to present-day reptiles. It is the tuatara which is found in New Zealand. It is only 30 centimetres in length, very different from the enormous dinosaurs which interest children.

For some years, there were rumours about a dinosaur-like creature called the Loch Ness monster which lived in the depths of a lake in Scotland. A Londoner, George Spicer, and his wife, saw "the nearest approach to a dragon or pre-historic animal" that he had ever seen in his life. He was in his boat when he saw it trundling across the road toward the Loch carrying "an animal" in its mouth. Scientists have for some time been trying to photograph the monster and record the sounds it makes but they have not succeeded.

So the only dinosaurs we have today are the bones of some of them in certain museums, and the only live ones are the tiny tuataras of New Zealand.

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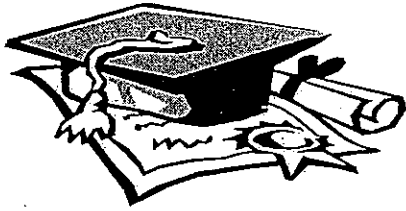

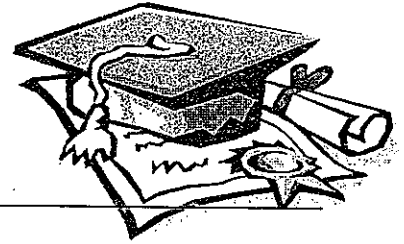
