The Singapore Botanic Gardens was recognised as a UNESCO World Heritage Site at the 39th session of the World Heritage Committee in Bonn, Germany on Saturday, 4 July 2015. This Singapore attraction joins more than 1000 UNESCO World Heritage Sites. It is the third recognised Botanic Gardens after Kew Gardens in England and the Padua Gardens in Italy.

The Singapore Botanic Gardens is home to Burkill Hall, a rare colonial house which was built almost 150 years ago. Built before the days of air-conditioning, Burkill Hall was designed to be cool and airy, with high ceilings. It may even be the last surviving example of what we call the Anglo-Malay plantation-style house.

Next to Burkill Hall lies the National Orchid Garden. It houses an immense assortment of orchid species. To build relationships with other countries, more than 200 orchid hybrids are named after prominent figures.

Beyond heritage, the Singapore Botanic Gardens is also the ideal place for many funfilled activities. On weekday afternoons, students of all ages visit it to learn about the flora and fauna. On weekends, friends and families may enjoy a picnic or a leisurely stroll. They may even watch musical performances at the Symphony Lake.
