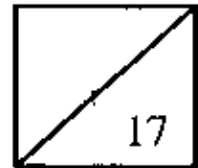

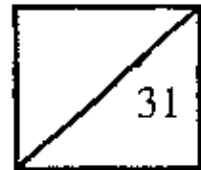

When the ocean floor is tilted or offset during an earthquake, a set of waves is created. These waves are similar to the ripples we see in a lake when a pebble is dropped into the water.

Usually tsunamis move entirely across an ocean to the shore. A tsunami can reach speeds of 800 km/h. When the waves enter shallow waters, they grow rapidly, reaching a height of fifteen metres or more at the shore. The towering walls of water have incredible energy because of the great volume of water affected and they are capable of killing thousands of residents along the coast. In 1896, a population of twenty thousand in Sanriku, Japan were wiped out.

Since the year 1819, more than 40 tsunamis have struck the Hawaiian Islands. A tsunami warning system has been developed in this area. This is because Hawaii, the highest risk area, experiences one tsunami every year, with a highly destructive tsunami occurring every seven years.

The tsunami warning centre in Hawaii monitors disturbances in the ocean floor that may cause tsunamis. When such disturbances are recorded, they are tracked and a tsunami warning is issued to the threatened area. During a tsunami, most deaths occur as a result of drowning.
