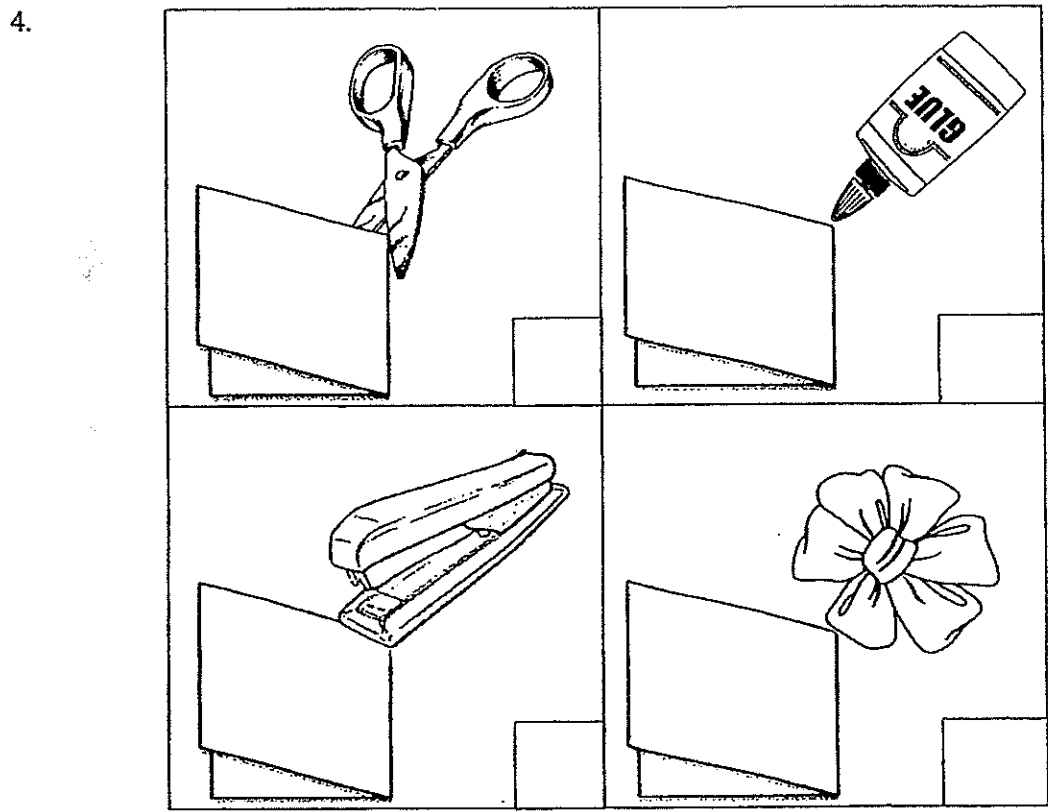

Read the passage carefully and answer the questions that follow.

Rosie was home and about to have breakfast when I dropped in to see her. She asked me to join her. As I had already had mine, I sat down for a cup of coffee. I was captivated by what Rosie was having. She was enjoying a bowl of hard-boiled eggs followed by large gulps of coffee. I was afraid that I might have appeared a little rude watching her eat but curiosity got the better of me.

It was the eggs that caught my attention. I could see they were hard-boiled and roughly mashed. However, the end result was rather black. It puzzled me.

"I like my eggs this way – hard-boiled, roughly mashed and with a generous dash of black soy sauce," Rosie explained.

Now, I realised why the mash was black. Rosie went on to tell me about her grandfather. He used to make soy sauce and supply it to the villages nearby. He had a special recipe and made his sauce from black beans. He would steam the beans over a brick stove. When the beans cooled, he would mix them with a special mould. The mould caused the beans to ferment and, after four to five days, the beans would be covered with a powdery fungus, which he would wash away gently.

Rosie's grandfather would then dry the beans, salt them and pour them into large ceramic jars which were covered with plastic sheets and tied loosely. These would then be kept in the backyard to allow the beans to brew for six months.

Rosie's grandfather did not think much of the soy sauce that was produced in factories in large quantity because it was made from normal soya beans and wheat. Besides, preservatives were used.

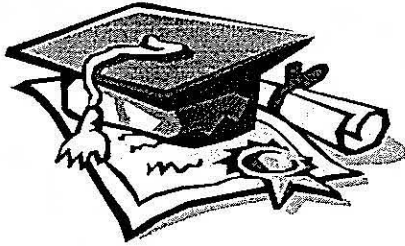
