SECTION G: COMPREHENSION 1 (8 marks)

Goalball is a team sport designed specially for the blind. It dates back to World War 2 when it was developed as an exercise to help soldiers who had injured their eyes to maintain an active lifestyle.

The game is played by two teams of three players. All players are required to wear black-out shades during the game. The objective is to score by throwing a ball across the court into the net of the opposing team. The goalball has several bells inside. The rattling sound of the bells guide the players to locate the ball. The opposing team must block the ball from entering their net with their bodies. The teams will take turns trying to score and defend their goals.

Unlike other spectator sports, spectators must remain absolutely silent during the match because the players rely heavily on their hearing.

Having missed the 2020 regional competition due to the pandemic and a shortage of players, Singapore's national player, Joan Huang, looks forward to the next one in 2023. "Although I have expected to encounter many obstacles playing this sport, I always tell myself that there's nothing hard work cannot overcome. Through the training, I have reaped many benefits — from better hearing to improved fitness. However, the best thing is to have made friends with those in similar situation as me. My teammates are like my family," she said.
