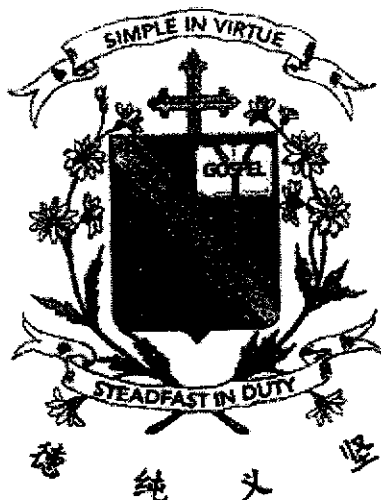

Wildlife Reserves Singapore (WRS) shared some good news recently. They made known (16) that a pair of tiger cubs were born last year. This is the first successful birth of the near-extinct (17) animal at WRS since 1988. It calls for a celebration as it was not an easy feat to achieve.

A total of 400 babies across 107 species were born or hatched in wildlife parks managed by WRS last year. Among these, 29 species are labelled (18) as "threatened" under an international conservation organisation.

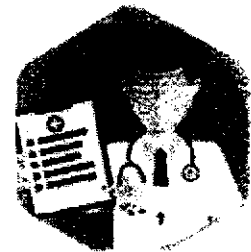

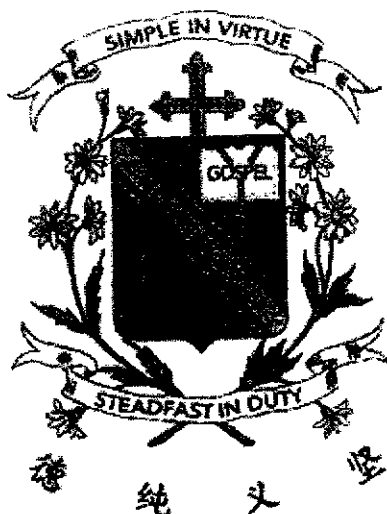

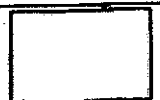
