5 The kangaroo is a national symbol of Australia: Its emblem is used by some of Australia's best known organisations, including its national airline, the Qantas. Kangaroos have been featured on coins, as well as being used as emblems, logos and mascots. **They** have also been used in the naming of sports teams. They are extremely well-represented in films, television, books, toys and souvenirs around the world.

Different species of kangaroos have different diets, although all are strict herbivores. Many species are nocturnal and spend the days sleeping in the shade, moving about and feeding during the cool evenings.

10 Larger kangaroos have adapted much better to changes in the Australian landscape caused by humans and though many of their smaller cousins are endangered, they are plentiful. They are not farmed to any extent, but wild kangaroos are shot for meat, sport, and to protect grazing land for sheep and cattle.

15 Kangaroos have large, powerful hind legs, large feet adapted for leaping, a long muscular tail for balance, and a small head. Like all marsupials, female kangaroos have a pouch to carry their babies around.

20 Because of its long feet, it cannot walk correctly. To move slowly, it uses its tail to form a tripod with its two forelimbs. It then raises its hind feet forward, in a form of locomotion called "crawl-walking."

25 Kangaroos are the only large animals to use hopping as a means of locomotion. This fast and energy-efficient method of travel has evolved because of the need to regularly cover large distances in search for food and water, rather than the need to escape predators. Therefore, the ability of a kangaroo to travel long distances at moderately high speed in search of food sources is crucial to survival.

30 Kangaroos are shy by nature, and in normal circumstances, they present no threat to humans. Male kangaroos often "box" amongst each other, playfully, for dominance, or in competition for mates. Kangaroos used their forepaws to punch and grapple with the foe, but the real danger lies in a deadly kick with the hind leg. The sharpened hind claws can kill an opponent. There are very few records of kangaroos attacking humans without provocation. Other suggested causes for dangerous kangaroo behaviour include extreme thirst and hunger.

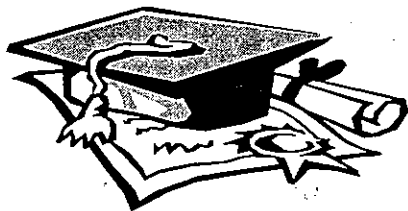

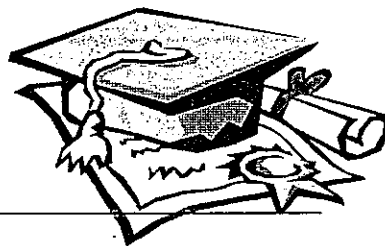
