There are more than 500 different kinds of carnivorous plants, with diets ranging from insects to spiders to one or two-cell organisms. To be considered carnivorous, a plant must attract, trap, kill and digest insects or other animal life.

One carnivorous plant in particular has captured the public's imagination - The Venus flytrap. Many people first see this amazing plant in action during their elementary school years and are fascinated by its strange dietary habits and unique appearance.

Although the Venus flytrap has captivated people across the world, the plant actually grows in an incredibly small geographic area. In the wild, these plants are found in a 1200-kilometre region along the coast of North and South Carolina. Within this area, they are further limited to living in humid and sunny areas such as swamps and wetlands.

Movies such as *Jumanji* and *Little Shop of Horrors* give the Venus flytrap a bad reputation. While Audrey, the mutant flytrap in the movie *Little Shop of Horrors*, developed a taste for humans, the Venus flytrap actually feeds on insects and arachnids like spiders, flies, caterpillars, crickets and slugs.

Non-carnivorous plants, on the other hand, depend on the soil around them for survival.

They must make amino acids, vitamins and other cellular components to live. To accomplish this, these plants absorb nutrients like nitrogen, magnesium, calcium and potassium from the soil.

Although Venus flytraps get a good deal of their sustenance like other plants do, the soil they grow in is not as rich. Thus, they eat insects to ensure they obtain the necessary amount of nutrients. In the swamps where they live in, the soil is acidic. Minerals and other nutrients are also scarce. Most non-carnivorous plants cannot survive in this environment because they cannot make enough of the building blocks that are necessary for growth.

The Venus flytrap has the ability to thrive in this unique ecological conditions because insects provide a good source of the nutrients that are missing from the soil. They also contain energy-laden carbohydrates.


