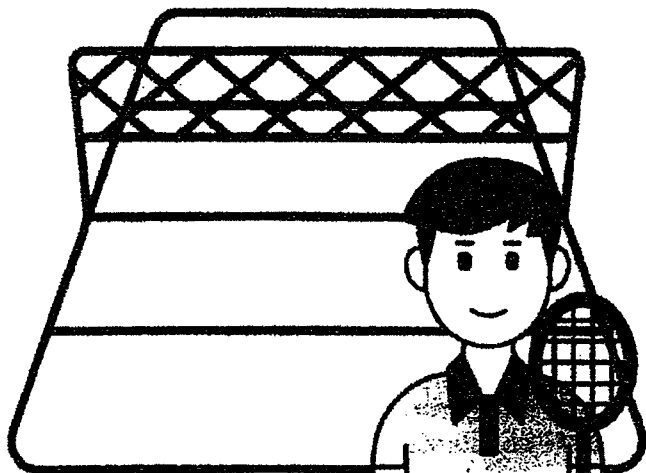
Have Fun and Get Fit
