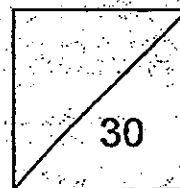

Read the passage below and answer Questions 26 to 30.

Junquan was just three years old when he lost both his arms in a freak electrical accident. However, his determination to overcome his disability and become a world-class swimming champion made this Chinese athlete an inspirational sports icon for many people around the world.

Junquan regularly defeated many top-ranking swimmers, including able-bodied ones, but the problem was that the only way he could mark his finish and stop the chronometer on the pool wall was by hitting it with his head at the end of the race - something that often left him with neck injuries or severe headaches. 5

At the Beijing 2008 Paralympic Games, Junquan, then 30, was surging ahead of his competitors and it appeared as though he was about to win the gold medal. However 10
in the last few seconds as he approached the end, he slowed down intentionally to reduce the impact of his head crash on the chronometer. In those few split seconds, Brazilian Daniel Dias, who was trailing him, hit the chronometer first with his outstretched hand, and claimed the gold medal. Junquan was forced to remain content with silver at 15
the final of the men's 200m individual medley.

Although Junquan was defeated at the post, he took great pleasure in the cut and thrust of top level competition. Despite coming in second, his huge smile at the end of the race and the cheerful manner in which he congratulated Daniel made Junquan the star of the day. The spectators knew that he would have taken the gold medal if only he had an arm. When Junquan was presented with a bouquet and his silver medal, he held 20
the flowers between his jaw and his shoulder, then grinning, he bowed to the crowd who gave him a thunderous applause.

"No one is perfect. Neither are able-bodied people," said Junquan. "I have no regret in my life. The most important thing is how you look at yourself. If you are confident and strong-minded, you will be the strong man in your life." 25

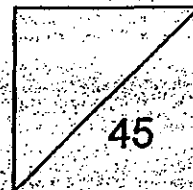

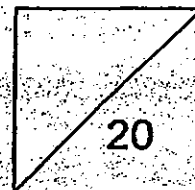

Dan could not understand the reference to tying a knot. Why should they have to tie a knot before they could go off duty? He did not have to wait long for the answer. The guard who had spoken 5
breathed heavily as he dropped something near the bottom of the sack. What the object was, Dan could only guess although it sounded like a heavy stone. He felt a rope being tied around his ankles. Before he realised what was happening, he was lifted off the stretcher by the two guards. He felt himself being swung to and fro. The last words he ever heard were the accompaniment to this swinging, "One, two, three! Heave!" 10

As the last word rang out in the cold night air, Dan felt himself being flung into space. He was falling, falling, falling through the dark, his speed increasing with every second. He felt a tug at his feet and knew that the heavy weight was tied to the end of the rope. There was a sudden jerk as he crashed into icy cold water. The waves closed over him as he was still dragged downwards. He had been flung into the sea with a 16-kg cannon-ball tied to 15
his feet.

Dan held his breath. He must get free quickly or die. He slit open the sack and struggled to free his legs from the heavy iron ball. His lungs seemed to be bursting. Gathering all his strength, he bent double and slashed through the rope . . . around his 20
ankles. It dragged him down towards the sea-bed. Along with it, the sack which he thought would nearly become his shroud*. Dan shot upwards. As soon as he surfaced, he gulped life-saving draughts of air into his lungs. He was worried. He quickly gazed upwards at the towering cliff from which he had made such a terrifying descent. He dived below the surface and swam away from the cliff while holding his breath for as long as he could before resurfacing for a gasp for air. 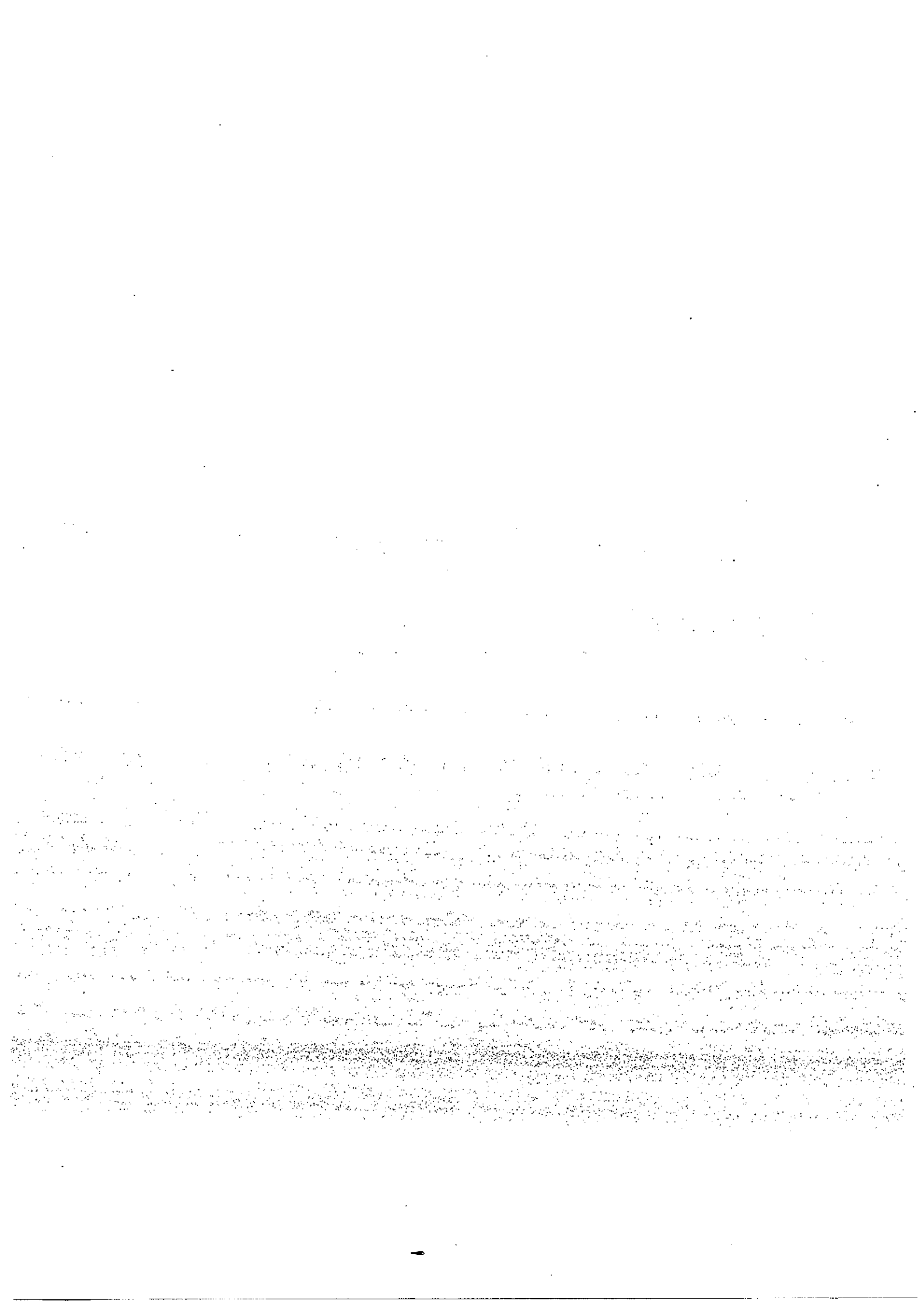
