He had trapped the 14month old gorilla in South Africa and smuggled it home. He kept the primate in a steel cage because he was afraid of losing it.

The gorilla, almost 2 metres tall, ate two kilogrammes of herbs, stems and roots every afternoon. It accompanied its master on evening walks in the forest and the occasional drive around town. During the evening walks, the gorilla aterplants and shoots, Norman believed that this has helped the primate to digest its food.
