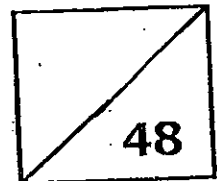

A team of scientists in Madagascar has discovered the fossil of the largest frog that lived on earth. The amphibian was called Beelzebufo or 'devil frog' and was the size of a beach ball. It was 40 cm long and weighed about 5kg. The name "Beelzebufo" comes from the Greek word for devil (Beelzebub) and the Latin word for toad (bufo).

Scientist David Krause made the discovery and is working with other scientists to find out how Beelzebufos are related to other frogs. They also want to understand how and why Beelzebufos ^{lived} live in Madagascar. Fossil frog experts Susan Evans and Marc Jones agree that other frogs related to the Beelzebufo are living in South America now.

Beelzebufo is one of the largest frogs on record. The size, appearance, and predatory nature of the frog caused its discoverers to call it the "armoured frog from hell." Not only was the frog huge but it was also powerful. In addition, it had a protective shield, an extremely wide mouth and powerful jaws. These features made Beelzebufo capable of killing lizards and other small animals, like hatchling dinosaurs.

Today, however, the largest living frog is not the Beelzebufo. It is the goliath frog which is found in West Africa. This frog is 32cm long and weighs about 3kg. In Madagascar today, the largest frog alive is just over 10cm and weighs about 1kg.

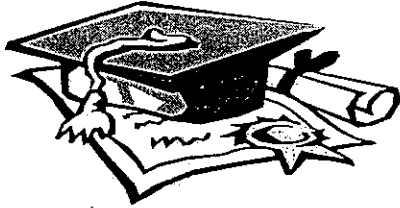

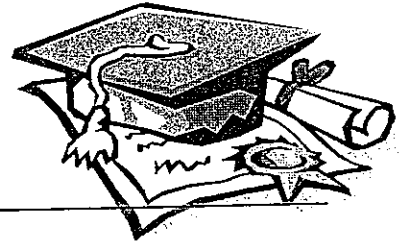
