



Grey whales spend the summer in the Arctic Ocean. In the autumn, they travel thousands of miles south to have their young in the warm waters of California and Mexico. The mothers keep a careful watch on their babies to protect them from any danger.

These gentle whales are indeed remarkable creatures. We should do our best to ensure their survival.
