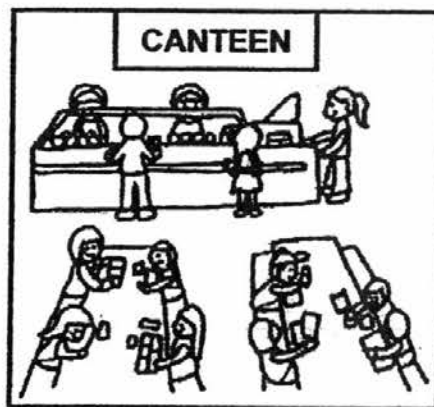
Write a composition of at least 100 words about a **bullying incident**.
