Have you ever heard the sound of a hummingbird? It beats its wings as fast as up to 80 times a second. All of that flapping makes a humming sound.

Hummingbirds hover rather than fly. Like a helicopter, they can stay in one spot in the middle of the air. Sometimes, they fly or hover upside down. They are the only birds that fly backwards.

Hummingbirds are small. The smallest bird in the world is the bee hummingbird. It weighs less than a small coin, just slightly bigger than a bee. The female tays only two eggs at a time. Their eggs are smaller than peas and their nests are so tiny that they have been found to fit on a clothes peg.

Hummingbirds need lots of energy to move swiftly. They eat a lot of food daily to survive. Hummingbirds primarily eat tree sap, insects and flower nectar. In order to get enough nectar, they visit hundreds of flowers. As they feed from the flowers, pollen gets on their heads and beaks. This helps the flowers to spread their pollen.
