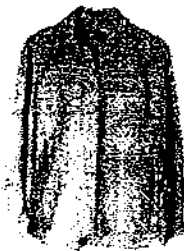

Some animals form a close partnership with other kinds of animals whereby one animal helps the other meet its needs. Some animals need each other because they like the same food. For example, the honeyguide bird and the ratel love honey yet each has a problem getting some. The bird can find a beehive but cannot open it. The ratel can open a hive but does not know how to find one. Therefore when the bird spots a beehive, it swoops down and makes a particular sound. The sound tells the ratel to come to eat. The ratel uses its sharp claws to tear the hive apart. It gobbles up most of the honey-covered mess and the honeyguide bird enjoys finishing off the leftovers. 5

Instead of swooping through the sky searching for insects, an oxpecker catches a ride on large animals ranging from antelopes to zebras. It picks ticks and other pests off its buddy's body. That helps the animal stay free of blood-sucking bugs. In exchange, the oxpecker gets plenty of food. It is a perfect partnership. 10

Land and sky animals are not the only ones that work together. One of the oddest sea couples is made up of the sea anemone and the clownfish. A sea anemone attaches itself to rocks or coral reefs and waits for a fish to swim by before it stings it with its tentacles. The stunned fish is then pulled into the sea anemone's hidden mouth. 15

The clownfish's body is shielded by a thick layer of mucus. The slime protects the clownfish from the sea anemone's dangerous stinging tentacles. When a hungry fish spots a colourful clownfish, it darts towards it. The clownfish safely swims under the sea anemone's tentacles. If the hungry fish follows, it gets stung and becomes the sea anemone's next meal. The brave clownfish reels in fish food for the sea anemone in return for its safety. 20

These animals make the most of their various differences. The unlikely partners pair up to get the most out of life. 25

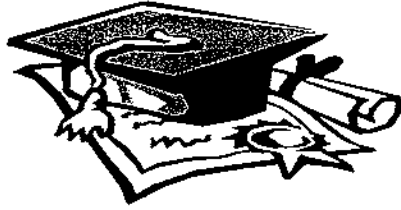

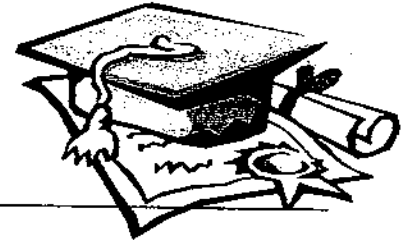
