Three pupils turned their love for making rainbow loom bracelets into a chance to raise funds for charity during the school holidays. The parents of the trio decided to convince their children, Isaiah Tang, 9, his sister, Kaira, 7, and Eliza Lim, 9, to raise funds for the Children's Cancer Foundation by selling the bracelets they had made. 5

The bracelets, which were made using small colourful rubber bands, were sold at a minimum price of \$2 per piece. Their target was \$1000. Isaiah said, "I thought it would be hard to meet the target because we said each bracelet had a minimum price of \$2."

Eliza added, "We would have to do so many and it would be very stressful. However, now we know we can raise more than we think." In fact, after the siblings' aunt and her friend publicised their fund-raising effort on Facebook, friends and relatives leapt to contribute. Some even bought bracelets at \$100 each. The pupils eventually raised a total of \$7,220.05 for the charity. 10

While the parents received orders from customers, the children were solely in charge of making the bracelets. They searched YouTube to learn new bracelet designs from videos there. Patterns that they mastered included the "inverted fishtail", "starburst" and Isaiah's favourite, "wayward". The only thing that frustrated them was when the rubber bands they used broke. Eliza said, "That is the worst part. If you are halfway through making a bracelet and one of the rubber bands snaps, you have to redo everything." 15 20

At the end of the day, their parents wanted them to learn that raising funds is not an easy task. Mr Tang said, "I hope that they have learnt valuable lessons, such as dealing with stress. There are orders to meet, so they have less time to enjoy activities such as watching television." 25

Suki was upset because even before she could talk to the fishes, she was already pulled out of the pond. Mr Tan was furious at what Suki had done. He asked her to change into a set of dry uniform and meet him in his office. 15

After Suki had changed into the dry uniform, she entered the principal's office. Mr Tan listened to what she had to say about the incident. When he realised that Suki did not mean to cause trouble, he did not punish her. 20

"Suki, you're really a good girl, you know." The principal's words echoed in Suki's mind all the time. These important words instilled confidence in her. This had definitely helped her achieve success in life. 25
