

Wildlife Experience in Singapore

The Sungei Buloh Wetland Reserve is a 200-acre reserve that is situated north of Singapore. Wander through our wildlife sanctuary where you will encounter many different species of Singapore's wildlife. Throughout the year, you can view at least 150 species of rare and exotic birds. Catch a sight of migratory birds, in particular shorebirds, from September to March. It is recognised as a site of international importance for migratory birds.




