

Earthquakes

Earthquakes are one of the most devastating natural disasters Man has had to experience. They are also among the scariest as they can happen without warning. They also cause terrible destruction to the cities we live in, causing cracks in the ground and landslides.

Earthquakes are the cause of other natural disasters like tsunamis. Thus, a city that is left suffering from one catastrophe can be faced with another minutes later. Haiti faced such a tragedy in 2010. What was worse is the fact that tsunamis rarely occur in the Caribbean Sea where Haiti lies. The people were unprepared for the double disaster. The cities are still being rebuilt but slowly due to corruption. Many people still live in tents six years after losing their homes despite global charity drives.

We in Singapore may feel that we are safe from such natural disasters. We are surrounded by islands which protect us from tsunamis. Though we do not live in an earthquake zone, many people live in high-rise housing. The tops of tall buildings sway at even the slightest tremor in nearby places. While those who live nearer the ground may not feel a tremor, those who live higher up may feel a moment of giddiness and experience the shock of seeing their hanging lamps swinging from side to side.

Our former Elected President, Mr Sellapan Ramanathan passed away on 22 August 2016. He was 92. His life had many unexpected turns as he penned in the book about his life "An Unexpected Journey: Path to the Presidency". Born in Singapore on 3 July in 1924, Mr Nathan, as he was commonly 5 known, had a comfortable life as the son of a law clerk. However, due to unforeseen circumstances, his father guitted the company and started drinking. He spent most of the little money he earned on liquor. He finally committed suicide. As Mr Nathan's family had no money, they lost their home. His aunt 10 gave his family a place to stay. Just as life was getting better, he was accused of stealing textbooks and expelled from school. He ran away to Malaya. Then the Japanese invaded Malaya. During the Japanese Occupation in the Second World War, the teenage Nathan learned to speak Japanese from reading an English-15 Japanese dictionary. His Japanese language skills got him a job in Johor. This led to him becoming the assistant and interpreter to the head of the Japanese police and his life improved. After the war, Mr Nathan became a civil servant, but in 1964, he caught the eye of Singapore's leaders when against the odds, he 20 helped Singapore to get into an international organisation by winning over the officials. Every time there was a tricky situation that required someone dependable, his name would be mentioned. He finally became our longest serving president in 1999, starting the President's Challenge to help the less fortunate. Through him, the 25 presidency became the most powerful fund-raising operation in the country. (273 words)
