






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

### **SECTION G: COMPREHENSION 1** (8 marks)

INational Day Parade (NDP) funpacks were first given out in 1991. Initially, they were meant as "survival kits", providing spectators with food, water and the parade programme. These funpacks have since become collectibles, sought after for the assortment of goodies. Unusual items in past years included pocket radios, special collar pins and light-emitting bracelets.

As the number of items in the funpacks increased over the years, there was greater environmental awareness. People wondered if the many items were necessary and called for eco-friendly materials to be used. Recyclable materials were used to make the bags for the first time in 2008. Bamboo straws doubling as clappers were included in 2019.

2020's funpack, named the Singapore Together Pack, had twelve items instead of twenty-five items. A hand sanitiser, face masks and a thermometer were included in a foldable reusable grocery bag. Single-use water bottles and plastic clappers were excluded since many celebrated the event at home. Each bag featured winning artworks done by artists with disabilities and Primary 5 students who had taken part in a competition held during the circuit breaker period.

Although each local household was allocated a funpack, some people had opted out of receiving it. They hoped the money saved could be used to help the needy and reduce environmental waste.
