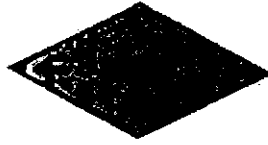
The pictures, not arranged in sequence, are provided to help you think about the topic. Your composition should be based on one or more of these pictures.

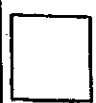
