Cheetahs are the world's fastest land mammals. These mammals were
widespread across African and Asian continents, but today they are confined mostly to
the open grasslands of Africa.
Cheetahs are known for (11) spotted fur. They have
about 2,000 to 3,000 spots on their bodies, which help them to camouflage themselves.
The spots are both small and large and the pattern of spots (12)
unique to each cheetah. The spots help them to (13) in with their
surroundings so that they can stalk and hunt their prey more effectively.
Cheetabs are not strong predators but they are fast. They rely on their
(14) up to 113 kilometres per hour - to catch their prey. Cheetahs
have slender bodies, powerful legs and flexible spines. These characteristics allow
cheetahs to stretch their bodies and take rapid strides.
Running this fast (15)up a lot of energy. A cheetah can
only sprint for a few minutes before burning out. With this limiting factor, it tries to get as
to its prev before starting the chase. The
sheetah offen (17) among bushes and sneaks up on its
tinesticnecting prev until it is confident (18) ine attack. It their dates
out of its kilding and the chase starts. Once the prey is (19), the
cheetah strangles the animal to death and drags it to a highly spot. A cheetan never
returns to a kill as it only consumes fresh meat. When a cheetah is ill or injured, it cannot
capture and (20) its own prey. As a result, it often starves to death.
Before unleashing their speed, cheetahs use their exceptionally keen sense
of (21) to scan their grassland environment for signs of prey.
They are able to spot their prey up to 5 kilometres away. (22) their
super vision is not effective at night. For this reason, cheetahs only hunt during the

As fast as cheetahs are, they cannot outrun the threats that they face. Once
found throughout Asia and Africa, cheetahs today are (24)
extinction. Loss of habitat and declining numbers of prey threaten the future of these cats.
Today, there are fewer than 7,500 cheetahs left in the wild, (25) the
cheetah Africa's most endangered big cat. Several organisations such as the Cheetah
Conservation Fund are working tirelessly to rebuild the cheetah population.
