

Earlier in June this year, Jason Chee returned to work at the Singapore Navy to take on a new role - as an Operations Supervisor at the Changi Naval Base. Indeed, his return capped a remarkable comeback. In December 2012, he met with a horrific accident on board a warship. Fortunately, he survived but needed a lot of help. Following an appeal by the Navy, Jason received overwhelming support, with many people donating blood and money.

After his initial operation, he broke down in shock. When he regained consciousness, he realised that he had lost both his legs. He also found out that his left arm and three fingers on his right hand were gone. Nevertheless, Jason did not despair. He showed his undying spirit when the Defence Minister visited him at the hospital. Jason saluted in uniform despite his plight. I was inspired.

When my teacher challenged me to interview a person who had inspired me, I thought of Jason Chee immediately. I wanted to learn about his resilience. I was over the moon when he accepted my request for an interview through Uncle George, who was Jason's friend.

When I asked Jason what kept him going despite his injuries, he replied, "The Navy has been taking good care of me throughout my recovery journey. I was very touched when I knew that they have been widening doorways and installing ramps to help me adapt to the new workplace. It is the support from the Navy family that pushes me to go on and not give up." Before his return to the Navy, I learnt that Jason kept himself busy with his rehabilitation programme, which involved training with his prosthetic legs to enable him to stand up and walk normally.

"Although the training is tough, I will not give up because I want to achieve my goal, which is to be able to walk on my own again. I want to take care of my family and my future despite my condition," said Jason. Deeply moved, tears welled up in my eyes.

During the interview, I found out that Jason had also taken an active interest in sports. The former school paddler rediscovered his love for table tennis and was helped by the Singapore Disability Sports Council. In January this year, he represented Singapore and went on to win a Bronze team medal in the 7th ASEAN Para Games held in Myanmar. He aims to take part in the 2016 Paralympics in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.
