carefully draws the outline of her hair, then traces in the rest of her body mertikulously. He  (40)
selects his pencil crayons with precision so that the colours match these of his mother's outfit
as if he were painting by numbers. He looks up at her every few minutes to check the
resemblance, smiled with satisfaction. It is obvious that he is a keen observer as he is focussed
and calm.
However, he was not always this way. When he was younger, he often had a look of
confusion on his face, had few friends in the neighbourhood and would lash out in <u>infuelreation</u> .  (43)
His parents were concerned that their son should not be able to go to school as he had  (44)
problems fitting in. Often, they were <u>ambaressed</u> by his antisocial behaviour. This was before
they discovered, with the help of a local charitable organization, that he was eighty percent deaf
in both ears. Suddenly all his confusion and frustration were understandable to the people
around him. His inability to hear and communicate had caused his parents a great deal of
concern and sadly, he could have been <u>diaknosed</u> earlier, if not for the fact that he was a
Roma. The Roma people make up the <u>larger</u> minority population in Europe and have faced
generations of social and institutional discrimination.

There is an estimated 3.7 million Roma in the Central and Eastern European region, of
which, approximately 46 percent are children. Roma families face a number of challenges in

ensuring that the basic needs and rights of his children are respected. Most Roma people live in

settlements which are predominantly ignored by governmental health, education and wellfair

services. Families often fall below the poverty line and live under the margins in society. In
order to break the vicious cycle of poverty, one of the most enduring solutions is education - (50)
making sure that all children can <u>axersize</u> their rights to attend schools which embody the
values of equity and inclusion.
