As Paul, an African, set off to lead a group of tourists on a kayaking trip down the river, it seemed like just another day's work. For many years, Paul, the owner of a river tour business, had been taking people on trips along the river. However, in just a few hours' time, his life would be turned not only upside down, but upside down and head-first up to his waist in a hippo's throat.

Hippos kill around 300 people a year, making them the third biggest killer of humans after mosquitoes. Their gaping mouths span four feet and are lined with fearsome teeth. On land, they can reach speeds of 30 miles per hour, but they are most dangerous in the water, where the male hippos can become territorial. Paul was well aware of the danger these creatures posed.

On the day of the attack, Paul was accompanied by three guides - Alex, Ben and Mike. They were all in separate kayaks and approaching the end of the tour when they came across a pod of hippos wallowing quietly in the shallow waters of the lake. Paul steered Ben and Mike away from the danger. He looked for Alex. He paused a moment so that Alex who had been lagging behind could catch up. He turned just in time to see Alex 15 splashing into the river when his kayak capsized. Paul immediately rushed over to help him. Just as he was about to grab hold of Alex's hand, all hell broke loose.

A hippo bit Paul and dragged him under water. "My world went dark and strangely quiet. A few very long seconds ticked by as I tried to figure out what was going on. From my waist up, I was submerged in the river. The hippo bit my head and started swallowing 20 me head-first down its throat. Is pushed, pulled and wiggled about, but to no avail. Then, the monster loosened its grip long enough for me to escape. Bursting to the surface, I came face to face with Alex," Paul wrote in his blog.

Paul remembered his panic. The sight of his blood mixing with the water made him nauseous. He wondered whether he would bleed to death or drown first. Fortunately for 25 Paul, Mike risked his own life to paddle back and help him. Paul was able to grab hold of Mike's kayak and was hauled to the shore. However, he was far from being out of danger.

"I made the mistake of taking a look at myself," he continued, "my left arm from the elbow up had been badly crushed. Then, a strange thing happened. I went incredibly calm and all the pain went away. I knew that this was my moment of choice. I knew right 30 there and then that I could either drift off or choose to keep living."

Paul chose to live. "The choice I made brought with it more pain than I could ever have believed that I could endure. The pain was so intense that I thought for sure I was going to die before I received medical help. There were moments when I wished that I had died just to escape that excruciating agony, but I held on," he wrote.

Paul had to endure a gruelling eight-hour journey to the nearest hospital. In the end, his left arm had to be amputated at the elbow, but the surgeons managed to save his injured leg. Although the road to recovery was going to be a long one, Paul had miraculously survived the usually fatal attack of an adult male hippo.
