

Ministry of Education scholar, Klement Foo, hopes to spark passion in students for his favounte subject-Chemistry.

While no sparks flew the day he stepped into a chemistry laboratory, he fell in love that day - with a subject that was to have a major influence on his path in life. "One reason I decided to teach is my love for Chemistry. I had wanted to read Chemistry in university since I was 14 when I was first introduced to the chemistry laboratory," says the former student of Chinese High School and National Junior College.

The choice of Imperial College in London where the 23-year-old is now studying on an Education Merit Scholarship, was also dictated, in a sense, by the subject. "I read that Imperial College is world renowned for research in Chemistry. I also had some advice from my seniors. They said that Imperial seems to offer a more intensive course with a large part of the education being in the research laboratories." His seniors were right. Now a final student in the university's three-year honours degree programme, Klement is in the laboratory four days a week, 11 am to 5 pm, except for a break for lunch. This is in addition to two hours of lectures each morning.

Klement does not mind the rigorous system that he is put through. "I actually enjoy the hectic lifestyle as I would not have the opportunity to have a similar experience when I graduate," he says. "Hectic" is an apt description of his life in university. In addition to chemistry lessons, he squeezes time out for a non-credit course in Spanish as well as extra-curricular activities. He was in photography society in his first year, and even tried out judo for a while. He is an active member of the Imperial College Singapore Society. He helped organise the Singapore Society's annual charity event in 2006 and 2007. Representing the society in floorball at intervarsity competitions for Singapore societies in the United Kingdom, he helped to garner a silver in 2006 and a gold in 2007. Being active outside school allows Klement to know more people. To him, friends are very important when one is overseas.

In 2007, Klement won a prize from his college for excellence in Organic Chemistry. Klement will graduate with a Bachelor of Science in Chemistry in July, 2008. The three years spent in the United Kingdom have not just expanded his knowledge in Chemistry, but also shaped his views on the kind of teacher he wants to be. Now, he aspires to look beyond examination grades and inspire his students' love for Chemistry. He hopes that, ultimately, they will gain something apart from the final certificate.
