

The only time I saw John in person, was when he was shuffling towards the start of the Commonwealth Games cycling road race. His jersey was absorbing water like a towel. John was the star of the Kenyan Riders. The team's mission was to become the first black African team to participate in the Tour de France.

I had hoped to catch John again on several occasions but was not successful. That was in August. Two months later, a tragedy struck. It happened during a race in the Philippines when a car hit John as he went round a bend. John was only thirty years old, leaving behind a wife and a baby. At the team's headquarters in the Rift Valley, Iten, the Kenyan Riders were still trying to make sense of the tragic incident. "It is shocking," said his team-mate, Emmanuel. "He was the heart of the team." Thus, after John's death, the team decided to raise funds to help 10 his wife and child.

The team had pinned much of their hopes on John, who was very promising and skilful. "When you put him on a bicycle in a race, he would charge ahead like a predator after a prey," the coach said. "He was a fantastic competitor, not aggressive, but when it got to serious training, he really shone."

John's death was a huge setback for the team, as well as a devastating personal loss for Leong, a photographer from Singapore, who founded the Kenyan Riders six years ago. Leong felt compelled to go to Iten because he was troubled by why there were no African riders among the winning cyclists.

In 2005, having watched Kenyan runners dominate the Singapore marathon, Leong 20 bought a ticket to Iten on a whim. Nearly a decade on, and having spent \$250,000, the solution was not as easy as he had hoped. In theory, many Kenyans in Iten were blessed with a pair of strong lungs, which were strengthened by the altitude and the Rift Valley's steep slopes.

Meanwhile, the riders faced another problem - the repeated interference from the Kenyan Cycling Federation. When the Kenyan Riders were in Australia to train for two months 25 for the Commonwealth Games, the Federation ordered them back to Iten and spent three days reprimanding them. The Federation did not understand why there was a need for them to travel overseas to train. Thus, the Riders had to look for a second camp in Australia.

Leong had not given up guiding the team to the highest level of professional cycling. "We want to get a team into the Tour de France," he said. "In ten years, this will happen. We will win 30 the competition and people will think it's the most wonderful thing in the world. There's real talent here in Africa. We're just looking for all the stars to align and everything will fall into place."
